The Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund (Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students)

1. Academy for Salon Professional, LLC acknowledges that the institution signed and returned to the Department the Certification and Agreement and the assurance that the institution has used, or intends to use, no less than 50 percent of the funds received under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students.
2. The total amount of funds that the institution receives from the Department pursuant to the institution's Certification and Agreement [for] Emergency Financial Aid Grants was provided to enrolled Students based off the qualifications to receive the grant.
3. The 50% of the total amount of Emergency Financial Aid Grants was distributed to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act as of the date of submission (i.e., as of the 30-day Report and every 45 days thereafter).
4. The total number of students (57 students) at the institution was eligible to participate in programs under Section 484 in Title IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965 and thus eligible to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act.
5. The 57 students received an Emergency Financial Aid Grant under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act.
6. Funding was based off those actively participating in distant learning (added expense to continue school online) and those on a Leave of absence due to Covid-19. The conditions to continue online was used by the institution to determine how much funding was received from the Emergency Financial Aid Grants and how much they would receive under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act. All actively participating received the same dollar amount and all of those on a LOA received the same dollar amount.
7. All students signed and acknowledged the instructions, directions, or guidance provided by the institution to the students concerning the Emergency Financial Aid Grants.
